Provide evidence-based assessment and treatment for PTSD

Supervise practicum and pre-doctoral intern trainees in assessment and evidence-based treatments for trauma-related disorders

Conduct program evaluation effectiveness research with a particular emphasis on the role of safety behaviors in the treatment of PTSD and anxiety.

Validated a brief scale of PTSD-related safety behaviors (see program of research for more information)

Regularly used at assessment, pre-treatment, and throughout treatment to measure progress (or lack-there-of) in reducing safety behaviors

Pre-scores predicted post PTSD scores (while controlling for pre-PTSD scores)

Analyses revealed that changes in two specific safety behaviors (i.e., watching others for danger and sitting with back to wall) demonstrated extremely large correlations with post-treatment scores and treatment change scores.

These items are now highlighted on the measure

Provide training and consultation in prolonged exposure to trainees

Developed and authored treatment manuals for safety behavior elimination therapy for anxiety (BTAD) and PTSD (BTAP).

Authored both client and therapist workbooks

Train and provide consultation to trainees and staff members

Gather outcome data which shows large reductions in anxiety and PTSD.

Safety Behavior Elimination Therapy for PTSD is now one of the 4 main treatments offered on the SLC PCT.

Created and in the process of validating the Intrusive Memory Questionnaire (IMQ)

Designed to help identify when traumatic memories have been sufficiently processed

Designed to assess various aspects of intrusions with one item that differentiates rumination from intrusions.

Measure is used as a regular part of assessment and treatment on the SLC PCT

with was limited therapist resources and overwhelming demand for therapy, resulting in low provider morale

Evaluated the effectiveness of Prolonged Exposure Therapy for PTSD (i.e., program evaluation research).

Findings were published in peer-reviewed journals

Findings of treatment predictors were used to inform clinical practice.

Examples include inclusion of a safety behavior measure at pre and post treatment, a PTSD treatment expectations measure at pre-treatment, discussion of service connection status prior to beginning treatment, etc.).
